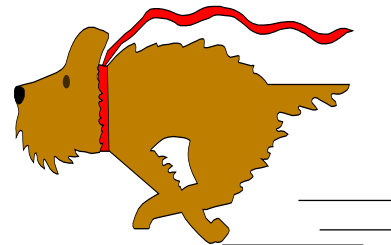

Anysize Jumping & Anysize Agility:

Only open to dogs that are not entered into any other classes at this show. These classes are intended for older dogs, younger dogs, dogs returning to Agility after injury / ill health, or dogs that don't fit in elsewhere. There will be no tyre, long jump, or weaves in the Jumping Classes. There will be no tyre, weaves, long jump, or see-saw in the Agility Classes. The Dog Walk will be set at a height of approximately 1 metre (3ft 3ins), and the A-Frame will be set at a height of approximately 1.52m (5ft 00ins). Handlers will have a choice of which height of jump they run their dog at, i.e. either: 45cm - medium, 35cm - small, or 20cm - Micro. This will be irrespective of the size of their dog.

Pause Box Challenge:

This will be a standard Agility type course, but approximately half way round the handlers will have to leave their dog in a Pause Box (in a sit or down or stand) whilst the handler negotiates the adjacent weave poles. Standard marking will apply including faults etc. for the handler if they do not undertake the weaves correctly. Once the handler has negotiated the weaves, they can collect / call their dog from the Pause Box and continue the course. Five Faults will be given each time the dog leaves the Pause Box. The dog will not be required to attempt the weaves.

Silent Jumping:

This will be a standard Jumping type course, where the Handler is not permitted to give any verbal commands or make any type of noise. Any handler giving verbal commands or making any noises, e.g. clapping their hands, will be eliminated. *A verbal start line release command will be permitted.* In addition to Rosettes & Trophies for each size of dog / height jumped, the overall winner will be presented with the "Triffic Travis Memorial Shield" in memory of our Deaf & Epileptic Dog, Triffic Travis.

NBC (Nothing but Collies) Classes:

Only open to Border Collies, Working Sheepdogs and their crosses. In the event of a dispute, the Judge's decision will be final.

ABC (Anything but Collies) Classes:

Open to all dogs except Border Collies, Working Sheepdogs and their crosses. In the event of a dispute, the Judge's decision will be final.

Practice Ring:

A Practice Ring will be available (if space allows) for dogs entered in any of the classes available.

Show Status:

This show is licenced by the Kennel Club and is being run in full compliance with all relevant Kennel Club Limited Rules & Regulations. ALL Dogs competing at the Redgates Show must be registered with the KC, and have a completed KC warrant / record book. All Small & Medium Dogs must be measured. Dogs that are obviously large need not be measured. If you are in any doubt about KC requirements, please check before entering.

Where the number of entries to a class or classes dictates, the Judge allocated on the Schedule for that class may need to change. Redgates will try and keep any such changes to a minimum.

All rings will be fully fenced and will have secure fenced entrances and exits.

LHO (Lower Height Option):

All large dog classes will have the option of LHO, where dogs can jump at Full Height (65cm) or Lower Height (55cm). However, each dog MUST jump at the same height in ALL classes. There will be separate awards for Full Height and Lower Height Dogs in all large dog classes.

Please make sure that your entry correctly indicates the height at which your dog(s) will jump.

Kennel Club rules stipulate that this cannot be changed after the show closing date.

Our Venue:

Please note dogs are not allowed in the Club House / Bar and the areas around the stables are out of bounds to all dogs and handlers. Showers will be located next to the entrance to the indoor arena. Parents are responsible at all times for the behaviour of their children whilst at our venue. Please respect the 5mph maximum speed limit throughout the venue.

Facilities for the Disabled:

If you are Registered Disabled and require a camping space near to the rings, please make sure that you indicate this on your Camping Form. Similarly, if you need a parking space close to the rings, please email or phone us to let us know. (Please note this facility is only available for Blue Badge Holders).

Camping:

Camping is available for Friday, Saturday and Sunday nights at a cost of just £12.50 per night. No arrivals before 2pm or after 8.30pm on Friday please. All units must leave the venue no later than 10.30am on Monday 5th August. Camping is limited to 200 Units. All camping units (plus cars, awnings and gardens etc.) must be within the marked-out camping spots. Roadways must not be obstructed.

Camping can only be booked by use of the separate camping form. We will confirm if you have or don't have a camping space via text or email within a few days of the receipt of your camping request form and full payment.

Camping spaces on our Main Field will initially only be for Judges, Ring Managers, and to people from clubs that are providing us with Ring Party. Only when we know that not all the available Main Field spaces have been taken will we open Main Field camping up to others. We will operate a Waiting List for Main Field spaces for those of you that do not fit into any of the above categories.

If you would like to camp, we recommend that you book and receive confirmation that you have a camping space before entering the show.

Evening Meals:

The Ashfields Club House will be open and serving hot food and drinks on both Friday and Saturday evenings. Menus and Pre-Booking Forms are available from the Redgates Club Website and Facebook Page. Please note that Ashfields do NOT accept payments via Credit or Debit Card

Measuring:

There will be official Kennel Club Measuring Sessions available at the show. Details will be made available in due course.

Dogs in Hot Vehicles:

Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to / from, and whilst at KC licenced events.

- When travelling to / from a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
- If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
- The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, plenty of stops should be taken with lots of water available to drink.
- Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free-flowing air around the dog.
- At the show, your dog is vulnerable and at risk if left in a vehicle in high temperatures.
- Keep the dog in the shade - take your own shade, for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
- Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.

Remember, if you feel hot, your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare. Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licenced event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.

Warning: If your dog is found to be at risk, forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage caused.

ELIGIBILITY FOR CLASSES

In the following definitions of classes First Prizes or other prize wins are those gained in standard classes at any Kennel Club Licenced Championship Agility, Premier Agility, Open Agility or Limited Agility Shows (i.e. special classes and invitational events excepted). Only a first place with a clear round completed within the course time set by the judge will count towards grade progression.

Standard classes may be scheduled for Agility Shows, as Agility classes or Jumping classes. All standard classes must contain the Weaving Poles obstacle. Standard Agility classes must contain the following elements: "A Ramp", Dog Walk and See-Saw. With this proviso classes are defined as follows: -

A maximum of four standard classes may be scheduled for any dog on an individual day of competition. Any number of Special Classes may be scheduled.

Class Structure. A Class may either be held as a Graded Class or a Combined Class. A Graded Class may be scheduled for a maximum of three consecutive Grades with separate results and awards issued for each grade. A Combined Class may be scheduled for more than one consecutive grade with one overall set of results.

Progression. Progression from each Grade will be determined by the eligibility for the class as referenced in Rule H(1)(A)11. Results from Combined Classes will only count towards progression from the dog's current grade. To count for Progression wins must be gained in standard classes at kennel Club Licenced Agility Shows. Only a first place with a clear round completed within the course time set by the judge will count towards grade progression.

Points Progression. At the handler's discretion, a dog may progress up to Grade 4 by winning 100 points at each grade, using the Agility Warrant points scheme (Regulation K3.c refers). A minimum of 50 points must be gained in agility (not jumping) classes in the relevant grade. If this method of progression is selected, the handler must ensure the Show Secretary signs the dog's Agility Record Book at the first show entered at the higher grade. There is no time limit on this progression, however once a dog has progressed, it cannot return to a previous grade. Progression on points must be done prior to the closing date of entries. It is not possible to change a grade on points once the entries have closed.

STANDARD CLASSES

Only first prizes and points gained in standard classes at Kennel Club Licenced Agility Shows may be used for progression through the classes. (A dog is only eligible for one grade). In defining the eligibility of the owner or handler for Grade 1, the two wins and points progression referred to in the definition apply only to one dog and not an accumulation of dogs.

Grade 1: For owners, handlers or dogs which have not gained a minimum of two first places at Grade 1 at Kennel Club Licenced Agility Shows, at least one of which must have been gained in an agility (not jumping) class. N.B. Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 1, are not eligible for this class.

Grade 2: Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grade 1, or have elected to progress on points from Grade 1 and are not eligible for Grades 3, 4, 5, 6, or 7.

Grade 3: Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of two first places at Grade 2 at Kennel Club Licenced Agility Shows, one of which must have been gained in an agility (not jumping) class, or have elected to progress on points from Grade 2 and are not eligible for Grades for Grades 2, 4, 5, 6 or 7.

Grade 4: Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of three first places at Grade 3 at Kennel Club Licenced Agility Shows, two of which must have been gained in agility (not jumping) classes, or have elected to progress on points from Grade 3 and are not eligible for Grades for Grades 2, 3, 5, 6 or 7.

Grade 5: Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of four first places at Grade 4 at Kennel Club Licenced Agility Shows, two of which must have been gained in agility (not jumping) classes, and are not eligible for Grades for Grades 2, 3, 4, 6 or 7.

Grade 6: Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of four first places at Grade 5 at Kennel Club Licenced Agility Shows, two of which must have been gained in agility (not jumping) classes, and are not eligible for Grades for Grades 2, 3, 4, 5 or 7.

Grade 7: Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of five first places at Grade 6 at Kennel Club Licenced Agility Shows, three of which must have been gained in agility (not jumping) classes, and are not eligible for Grades for Grades 2, 3, 4, 5, or 6.

SPECIAL CLASSES

Societies may schedule classes other than those defined above as "Special" classes. The eligibility for "Special" classes must be defined by the Society and included in the schedule. The word "Special" must be included in the title of the class. Where special classes are classified for older and/or inexperienced dogs, the height of the hurdles, the A-ramp, the Dog Walk and the length of the long jump, may be reduced below the dimensions specified in these regulations, in which case such dimensions must be included in the class definition in the show schedule.

Marking for special classes may deviate from marking for standard classes, but must be specified in the schedule. Wins, places and clear rounds in special classes will not count towards agility warrant points or grade progression at Kennel Club shows.

LOWER HEIGHT OPTION

Societies may offer the Lower Height Option to all dogs in that height category and may be offered at all grades. It is to be run as part of any Standard class as defined in the regulations and must be clearly identified in the schedule. Each relevant class will have two heights with a change part way through to raise/lower the jump heights, and may extend / reduce the length of the long jump and width of the rising spread, within the permitted ranges, and competitors must run at their entered height. The order in which the heights will run must be detailed on the ring cards/ring plan. There will be only one course walking at the start of the class. In a class where the Lower Height Option is available show organisers may offer one set of awards by combining the results of each height or may offer separate awards for each height category.

Competitors will be allowed to walk the course set at Small, Medium or Large height without their dog(s) before the class begins. Hurdles may be raised / lowered during the course walking time if multiple heights are offered within the same class.

When the Lower Height Option is scheduled a dog may only be entered at either the Full Height or at the Lower Height and it cannot compete at a different height in any other class at that competition, including special classes. For these purposes a competition shall be defined as all classes covered within the same schedule.

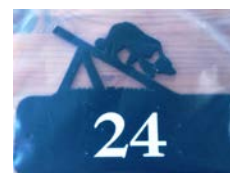

The Romi Memorial Challenge:

In addition to the normal Trophies and Rosettes, there will be a special award for the Best Gun Dog at our show. For all the Large and Medium Agility Classes on the Saturday (all day) and the Sunday morning of our show, we will note the name of the highest placed Gun Dog in each class. A Special Award will be given to the Gun Dog with the largest number of highest places. In the event of a tie, the award will go to the dog with the highest individual placings. This Award is kindly sponsored by Sue Neal in memory of her dog Romi.

Directions to our Venue:

From the South / West / North:

Make your way to Junction 8 of the M11 for Bishops Stortford & Stansted Airport. If travelling North on the M11 towards this Junction leave the Motorway via the first exit slip road.

From the roundabout (Start Hill) above the Motorway take the eastbound B1256 Dunmow Road towards Takeley. Please keep to the speed limit along this road and do not get caught by any of the speed cameras. After approximately 1 mile go straight across the traffic lights.

After approximately another 2 miles you will find yourself in the village of Takeley. At the traffic lights / cross roads in the middle of Takeley next to the Four Ashes Pub (on your left-hand side) turn right onto the B183 signposted towards Hatfield Heath, and Hatfield Broad Oak. Then follow the directions below *

From the East:

Drive west along the A120 from Colchester / Braintree / Dunmow towards Stansted Airport, Bishops Stortford and the M11. **Please note that your Satellite Navigation systems will probably take you off the A120 at the Dunmow South Junction and bring you in via the B184. The lane between the B184 and the venue is narrow and has few passing places and is therefore unsuitable for caravans / campervans.** All such vehicles should stay on the A120, go past the turn for the A130 / B1008 / B184 Dunmow South and Barnston, and leave the A120 at the next exit just after the "Rest Area" and take the B1256 towards Takeley.

Enter Little Canfield, go past the Lion & Lamb pub on your right, then go straight across 2 x mini-roundabouts. Enter Takeley and at the traffic lights / cross roads next to the Four Ashes Pub (on your right-hand side) turn left onto the B183 signposted towards Hatfield Heath, and Hatfield Broad Oak. Then follow the directions below *

* From the Four Ashes Pub / Traffic Lights in Takeley:

Drive south along the B183 Station Road towards Hatfield Heath and Hatfield Broad Oak. Go over the old slightly humped backed (disused) railway bridge, and past Takeley Sports Ground on your left-hand side.

After approximately 1 mile turn left onto an unnamed road and go past "Hartwood" on your left. Take the next 1st left turn heading towards Great Canfield and High Roding.

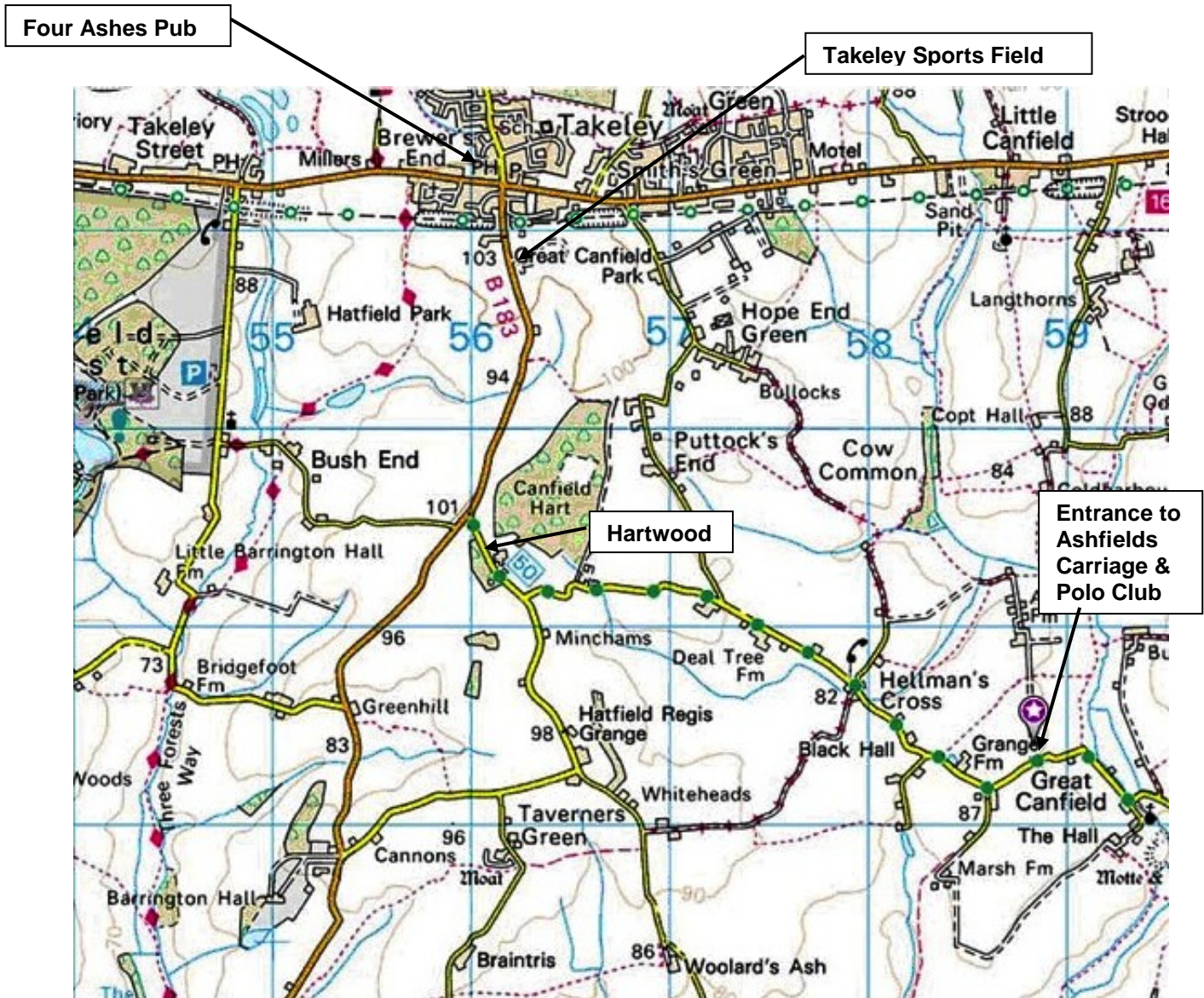
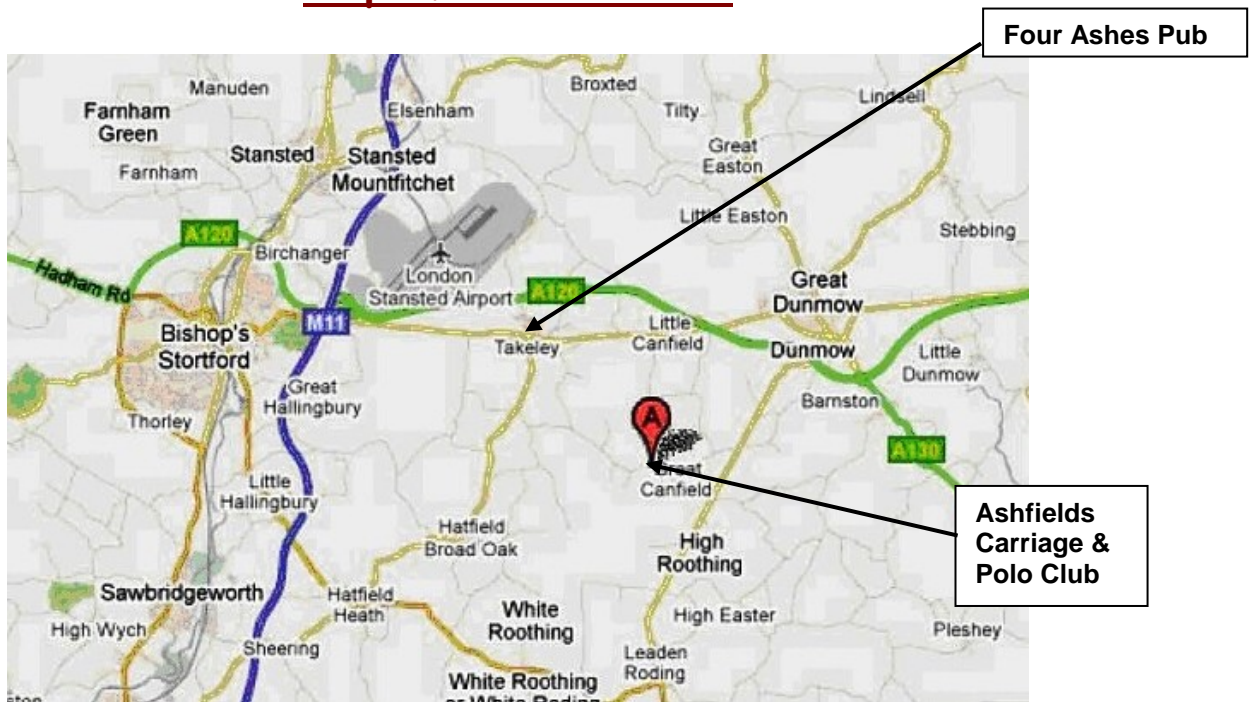
Keep going along this road for approximately 2 miles, towards Great Canfield along Green Street. Go through Hellman's Cross and then past Cuckoo Lane on your left, the Cricket Club on your right, Fitzjohns Lane on your right and Griffin / Grange Farm on your left. The road bears round to the left and the entrance to Ashfields is through the white gates on your left-hand side. Please keep to the 5mph speed limit along the drive and follow the signs / marshal's directions to the camping and / or parking areas.

For those of you with Satellite Navigation, the postcode of the venue is CM6 1JU.

Signs will be posted at key points along the route from the Four Ashes pub in Takeley.

SHOW RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Dogs entered at Kennel Club Licenced Agility Shows must be registered at the Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel Club Limited Regulations for Classification and Registration B, or else registration or transfer of registration must have been applied for. The registration number/ authority to compete (ATC) number will be required for each entry.
2. All dogs registered and resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete (ATC) number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without a Kennel Club Registration number or an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
3. Entry Fees: £3.50p per dog per class, or £2.50p per dog per class for Redgates Club members. Camping is available at a cost of £12.50p per night. Camping is free of charge to Redgates Club Members.
4. No monetary prizes are on offer.
5. Internet Entries are available via Agility Shows Online at <https://agilityshows.online>
6. Redgates Agility Club reserves to itself the right to refuse entries on any grounds.
7. Only dogs of 18 calendar months of age and over on the day of competition are eligible for competition at Kennel Club Licenced Agility Shows.
8. A dog must not compete in the same class more than once, including special classes.
9. No classes will be capped.
10. Not for Competition entries will be accepted for dogs aged four calendar months and over. Dogs must be Kennel Club registered with their details recorded on the entry form.
11. No bitch in season is allowed to compete.
12. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the competitions is forbidden.
13. No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the Show.
14. Dogs must not wear any type of slip, half-slip collar or lead when under test. A single flat, close fitting, leather or webbing collar is permitted, providing the only attachment is a plain identification panel as an integral part of the collar i.e. not attached by a ring.
15. Should a judge be unable to fulfil the appointment to judge, Redgates reserves the right to appoint another judge.
16. No competitor shall impugn the decision of the judge or judges, or be in anyway offensive to any member of a Ring Party or a Show Organiser. Any person infringing this rule will be required to leave the Show Venue immediately.
17. Sponsorship: Redgates would like to thank Spytech Embroidery for sponsoring some classes to the value of £100, Sue Neal for sponsoring the Romi Memorial Challenge, and EmPawsum for sponsoring one class on each day.
18. Kennel Club standard marking regulations apply for all standard classes.
19. Dogs entered in the Anysize Classes may not be entered into any other Classes at the Show. The Jump height for these classes will be 20cm, 35cm, and 45cm. The handler may choose which height to run the dog at irrespective of the size of the dog. For the Anysize Agility Classes the height of the A-Frame will be set at approximately 1.52m and the height of the Dog Walk will be set at approximately 1.00m.
20. The height limit for dogs.
 - a. Large Dog classes - For dogs measuring over 430mm at the withers.
 - b. Medium Dog classes - For dogs measuring over 350mm and measuring 430mm or under at the withers.
 - c. Small Dog classes - For dogs measuring 350mm or under at the withers.
21. Judges at an Agility Show may not enter for competition a dog which is recorded in their ownership or part ownership; or handle a dog at the Show at which they are judging. Dogs may be disqualified if proved to have been handled in the class by the scheduled judge's spouse or immediate family, or resident at the same address as the scheduled judge.
22. Removal of dogs from Competition: Following discussion between the show management and/or a veterinary surgeon, a dog shall be prevented from competing and/or removed from the Show if it is:
 - a. A bitch which is in season.
 - b. Suffering from any infectious diseases or contagious disease.
 - c. Interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent.
 - d. Of such temperament or is so much out of control as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal.
 - e. Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing.The circumstances of such a removal shall be recorded in the competition/show Incident Book and submitted to the Kennel Club.
23. Dog Agility is a competitive and physically strenuous activity. It is the responsibility of the owner/handler to ensure their dog is 'fit for function' and that they themselves are fit to take part. By signing the entry form, you confirm that to the best of your knowledge your dog is fit and able to take part in Agility classes on the day of the show.
24. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including 25 days before the start of the competition, i.e. (9th July 2019), shall be counted when entering for any class. For these purposes a competition shall be defined as all classes covered within the same schedule. In the event that a dog becomes eligible for the next grade at a particular show, after the entry for that show has been sent, it is the competitor's responsibility to notify Agility Aid at least 14 days before the date of the show (20th July 2019). The dog will then be moved into the appropriate class(es) for the next grade. The dog must be moved into the corresponding number of classes as were entered at the lower grade. If there are fewer or no classes available for the next grade the competitor will be offered a refund of the relevant entry fees.
25. Should circumstances so dictate Redgates Agility Club, in consultation with the Judges, may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them will be reported to the Kennel Club. Where the number of entries to a class or classes dictates, the Judge allocated on the Schedule for that class may need to change. Redgates Agility Club will try and keep any such changes to a minimum.
26. In the event that the show is cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances, Redgates Agility Club will refund fees, less reasonably incurred expenses. If the show processor has the provisions to do so, competitors will be refunded in the manner in which they had entered the show, but in any event the society will refund fees within 3 months of the show date to all those who had entered and requested a refund within 1 month of the show date.
27. Except for mobility aids, nothing shall be carried in the hand while the dog is under test and food shall not be given to a dog whilst

- in the ring. Competitors are prohibited from wearing bags or leads whilst under test.
28. Should the judge deem a re-run is required, any result and/or faults gained in the previous run must be discounted.
 29. Separate entry forms must be completed by each owner and must be signed by the owner or his / her authorised agent in accordance with provisions specified thereon. Entry forms must be accompanied by the appropriate fees. Overpaid fees will not be refunded.
 30. Free Passes: Not applicable.
 31. Competition of Dogs Suffering from Contagious or Infectious Disease - No dogs suffering from infectious or contagious disease or having been exposed to such disease during the period of 21 days prior to the Competition may compete. Competitors infringing the Regulation will be liable to be fined and/or dealt with under Kennel Club Rule A11.
 32. It is the competitor's responsibility to be available for their class and running order. Competitors must run as close to their running order as possible. Failure to do so may be reported to the Kennel Club.
 33. Animals in Event: No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance, except any dogs registered to assist the disabled, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the Board. However, at the discretion of Redgates Agility Club, a dog brought to the show by a spectator may be admitted into the precincts of the dog show, with the proviso that those in charge of the dog sign a declaration confirming the dog is free from disease and that the dog will be kept under proper control at all times.
 34. Pay on the day classes will be held each day if time permits.
 35. A Practice Ring will be available to dogs entered for competition at the show, if space allows. This ring will be supervised by a responsible adult with agility knowledge.
 36. Welfare of Dogs: An exhibitor (or competitor) whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licenced event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not knowingly put their dogs' health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. A breach of this Regulation may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Limited Rules and Regulations. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars or prong collars, is not permitted at any Agility show licensed by the Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue and with the precincts of the show.
 37. If you choose to download your ring cards, you are agreeing for the information on them to be publicly viewable online.
 38. The show organisers or their authorised agents may make results from this show publicly available and share results with third parties for the same purpose.
 39. Welfare of Dogs: Redgates Agility Club will be asking the Judges to strictly enforce KC Regulation H (10) C. (12), about dogs being "fit for function", as well as Regulation H3 "Welfare of Dogs", and Regulation H14(e) "Removal of Dogs from Competition if it is likely that suffering will be caused to the dog if it continues competing". Where a dog is removed from a competition class by the Judge, Redgates Agility Club reserves the right (after consultation with the Judge and the Handler / Owner) to withdraw that dog from entry to all other classes at the show.
 40. All dogs must be kept under close control at all times, and must be kept on a lead at all times unless under test or being exercised within the designated Exercise Area. No more than 3 dogs per handler / assistant shall be permitted off lead in the Exercise area at any one time.
 41. Horses are stabled and exercised in parts of the venue. Dogs are prohibited from being off-lead anywhere within the venue (other than a competition ring, or an enclosed & secure camping garden, or a secure vehicle) if there are horses visible. Anyone found breaking this rule will be asked to leave the venue immediately.
 42. Children under the age of 11 are the responsibility of and must be accompanied at all times by a parent or guardian including when competing.
 43. For Large Dog classes, dogs jumping at the Full Height (65cm) will ALWAYS run first. When there are no more dogs on the line for Full Height, the class will close for that height, and the jumps heights lowered accordingly. Once altered they will NOT be reset to the previous height for that class. Dogs must run at their entered height in ALL classes.
 44. For the award for the "Best Gun Dog" at our show, it will be the responsibility of the handler to let the person doing the Pads know if their dog is a "Gun Dog" or not.
